
What's the AMA Manual of Style anyway?

History

- First edition of an editorial manual for the AMA's scientific journals appeared in October 1962 for in-house use and authors
- Seventh edition published in 1981 entitled Manual for Authors & Editors and published by an outside publisher
- Eighth edition current approach of committee of 10 professional editors from the staff of JAMA and the Archives Journals responsible for content with peer review on all sections, published in 1989
- Tenth edition published in 2007 by Oxford University Press, now 1032 pages
- Eleventh edition, now 1200 pages, published in 2020 with simultaneous online edition

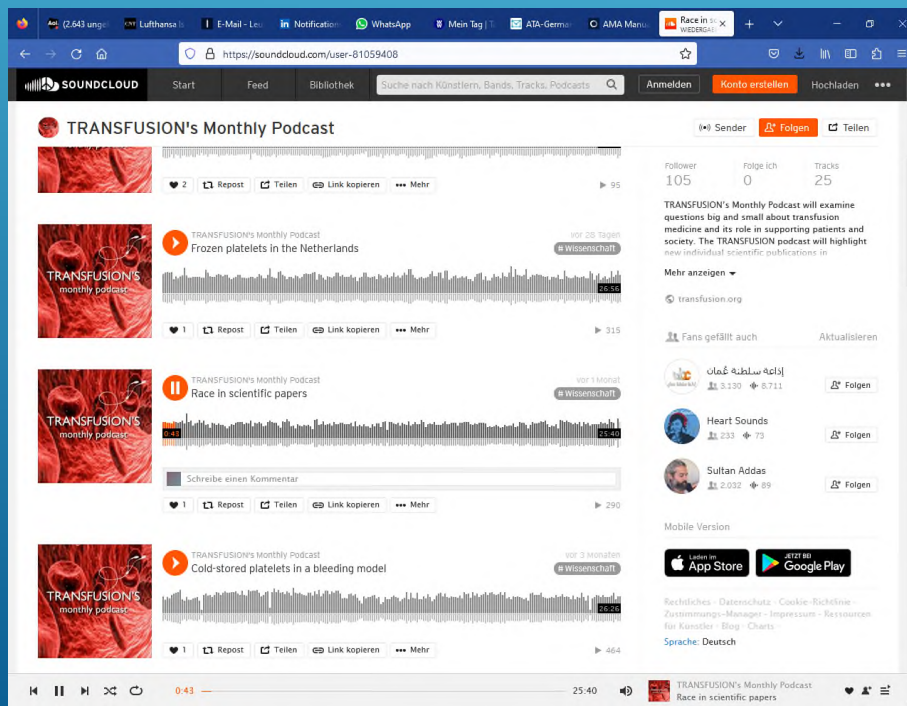
