Southern Market: 100 S Queen St. Lancaster PA (1.3 miles south of the Amtrak station)

- If arriving by train, you can Uber, walk, or contact Jamie or Karen for a ride (484 707 7259)

- If arriving by car, you can park at Steinman Park Garage (35 S Prince St) for under \$10 for the day

Built as a farmer's market in 1888, <u>Southern Market</u> is now a food hall and community hub with meeting rooms (where we will hold our event) and a variety of restaurant kiosks selling everything from Indian to Mediterranean to Thai to soul food. There's even a <u>Schnitzel Haus</u>!



Lancaster Central Market - America's oldest continuously operating public market (open Tue, Fri, & Sat from 6am-3pm) Decades - Retro bowling alley, arcade, and restaurant Fulton Theatre - Oldest working theatre in the U.S. (showing CATS in July 2025) Gallery Row - Two blocks of downtown with numerous local art galleries Tellus 360 - Irish pub & live event venue by day, bar/dance club by night

<u>Historic Rock Ford</u> plantation & Lancaster County Central Park <u>Wheatland</u> - Home of President James Buchanan (and next-door <u>Lancaster History</u> center) Covered bridge <u>self-guided driving tour</u> or <u>guided scooter tour</u>

<u>Sight & Sound</u> theater - Live theater producing musicals with biblical messages (showing Noah in July 2025)

Lititz - A small, walkable town 9 mi north of Lancaster with shops, cafes, and parks (home of <u>Julius</u> <u>Sturgis</u>, the oldest pretzel bakery in the U.S.)
